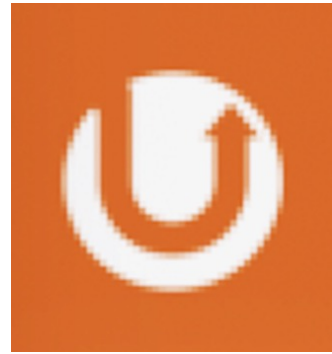

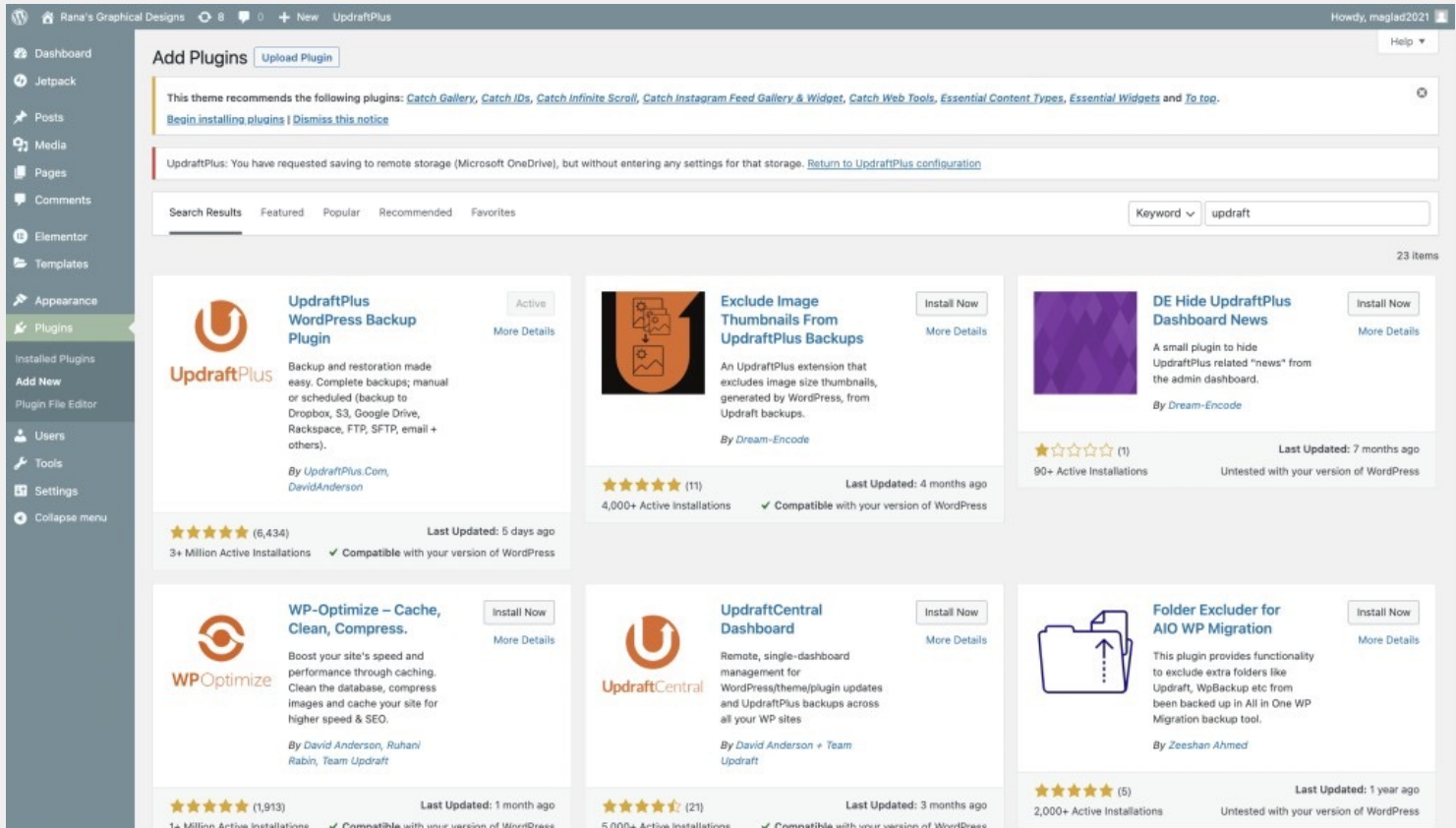

Step One:

Up-Draft

Updraft is one plugin that can be added to your webpage for regular automatic backups:



Wordpress's Plug-in pages with searches of different Updraft plug-ins.

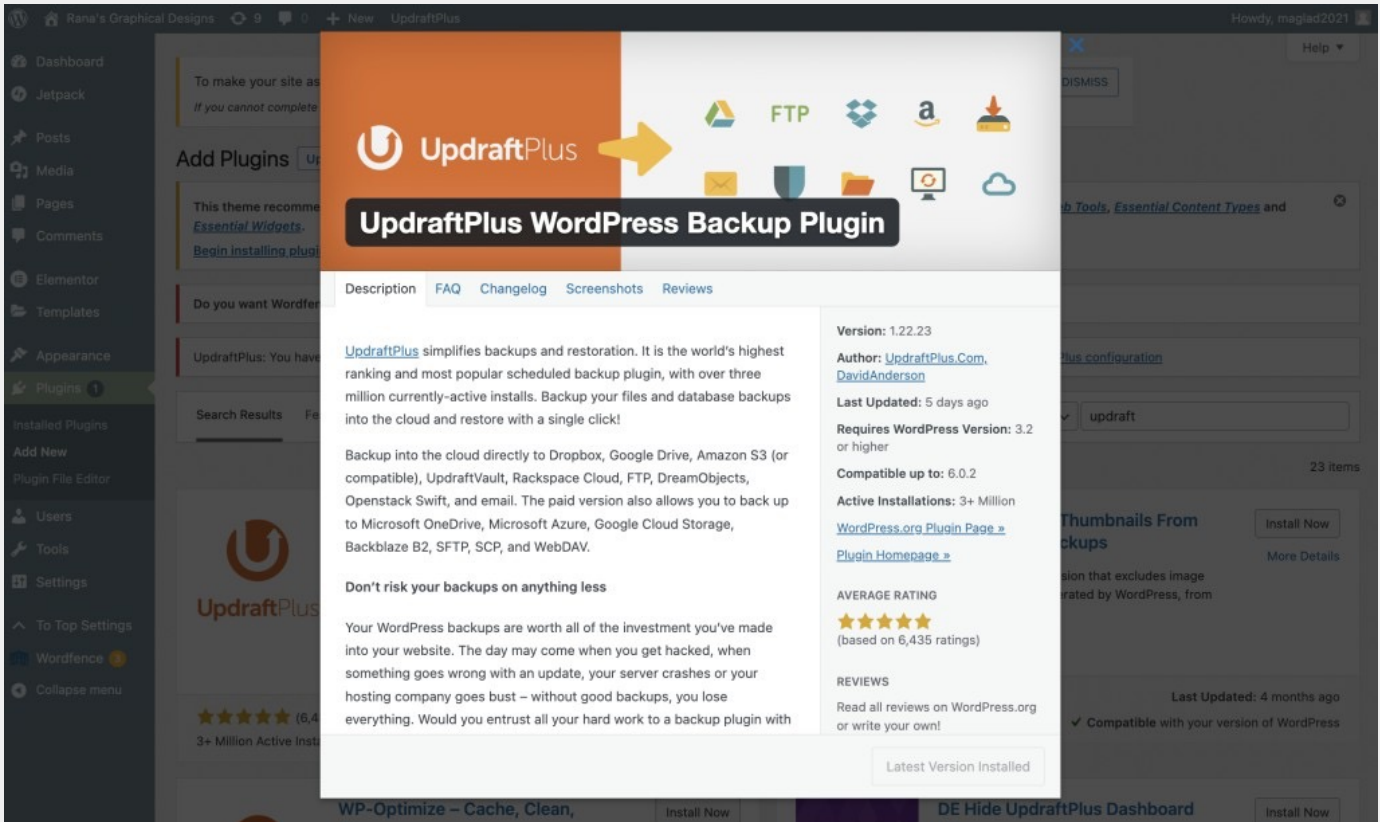
Keeping a regular routine to have your work and information constantly backed up is effective to ensure that no data or sensitive information is lost. Documents and files should often be backed up in a safe area to make sure that it is secure and safe, avoiding loss of data and avoiding theft from hackers getting their hands on this data.

Search for “updraft” in the search box, then select the first plugin that comes up.

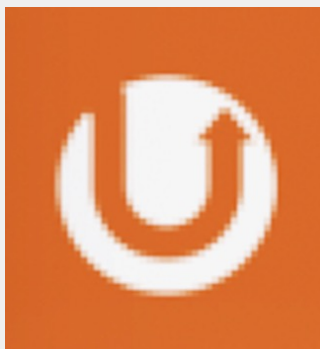


Updraft's settings with a selection of different ways to have your backup work automatically and in the way you wish it to process.

Updraft then allows you to alter the settings on how you prefer your backups to work, whether that's specific applications you need backing up regularly or targeted areas of your work.

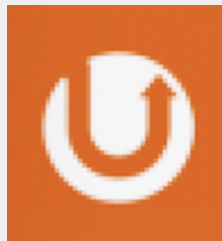
